## INFORMATION REGARDING THE REAL ESTATE SELLER DISCLOSURE LAW

The Real Estate Seller Disclosure Law (68 P.S. §7301, et seq.) requires that before an agreement of sale is signed, the seller in a residential real estate transfer must disclose all known material defects about the property being sold that are not readily observable. A material defect is a problem with a residential real property or any portion of it that would have a significant adverse impact on the value of the property or that involves an unreasonable risk to people on the property. The fact that a structural element, system or subsystem is at or beyond the end of its normal useful life is not by itself a material defect.

This property disclosure statement ("Statement") includes disclosures beyond the basic requirements of the Law and is designed to assist 3th Seller in complying with disclosure requirements and to assist Buyer in evaluating the property being considered. RE: Discoloration on 3rd floor Ceiling

During a recent home inspection, the inspector mentioned an area on the ceiling above the stairs going to the  $3^{rd}$  floor as a possible "mold like substance". We were asked to stop by and take a look at it to see what is going on, and to make any necessary recommendations to remedy the issue.

We are pleased to inform you that the discoloration on the ceiling appears to be a sticky substance that attracted dust, dirt or debris and became dark. During our inspection, we utilized thermal imaging and can confirm that this section of ceiling is not wet. This is not a mold issue due to water intrusion. In fact, this is not considered a mold issue at all.

According to guidelines set forth by the EPA, if you are growing mold in an area smaller than 10 sq ft., something that small falls under Normal Home Owner Cleaning & Maintenance. The reason is that anything that size or smaller does not pose a "Cross Contamination" issue for other parts of the home. There simply isn't enough mold present in an area that big that would affect other rooms in the home. So even if this were the most toxic mold on the planet, the total coverage area is less than 1 sq ft... much less than 10 sq ft.

As we discussed, clean with any non-bleach based cleaner. Mist the area with your cleaner then wipe with a damp cloth. If the discoloration or staining persists, you can paint over it to improve visual appearance. Other than that, there were no other issues pertaining to mold in this home.
